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George's Journey Spetember 2013

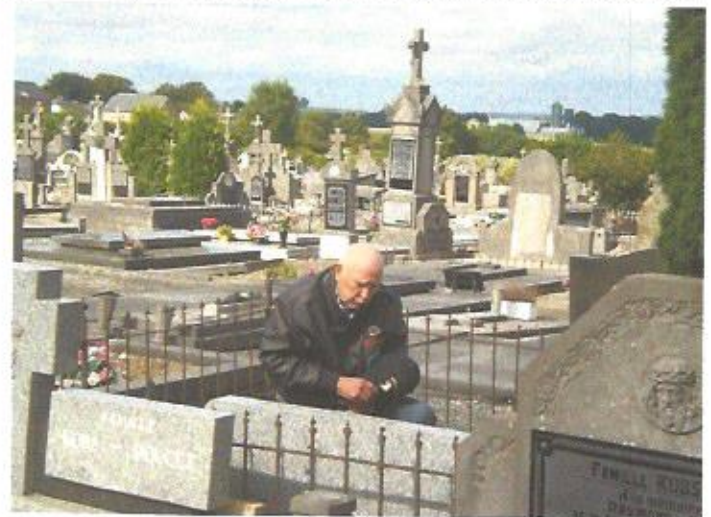
George Koskimaki, WWII, 101st Airborne HQ, Radio Operator, and author, /historian (*D-Day With the Screaming Eagles, Battered Bastards of Bastogne and Hells Highway*) with Dan Cutting, WWII Airborne Demonstration Team and Joe Chestnut were in Bastogne and Holland September 2013. We have a few of Dan's notes of their journey:



Sunday, Sept. 15, 2013: Photo above: George and the Mayor of Bastogne, Benoit Lutgen. Mr.

Lutgen's grandfather was also mayor of Bastogne and was executed by the German's during the war in Noville. Notice that George is also proudly wear his new ADT A-2 jacket! Reg Jans was wearing his also. George was also reunited with his great friend, Andre Maurise after many years. Today was an emotional one for George. He visited a display for two nurses that worked in Bastogne tending the wounded. Rene Lemaire was one and was killed when a bomb landed in the church that had been set up as an aid station. It was inaccurately depicted in the Band of Brothers mini-series. The other nurse survived and is still living today.

The above picture shows George on his knee at the grave of Rene. I kept my distance as this was a very private and emotional moment for George (and me). He told her of his deep respect for her



actions and the lives she saved as she sacrificed her own.

Although he never met her, he has a deep respect for medics, chaplains and nurses and surgeons that ministered on the fields of battle, and from here we went to the Peace Woods



We found the tree planted for George in the Peace Woods. There were trees planted there for all the Veterans that returned for the 50th Anniversary in 1994. The first tree died in 2010 and a new one was

planted in it's place. George can be seen holding a picture I brought with me of the last time George stood on that spot. With him, on the other side of the first tree, is his beloved grandson Matthew. Matthew lost his life in Afghanistan from an IED as he worked to protect dignitaries and diplomats that came to the area he was assigned to. He was taken from us in August of 2010. George found out today that the first tree, the one he and Matthew posed with, also died in 2010. Some may call it coincidence, George believes otherwise. It was difficult for George but it was a way for him to remember and honor his only grandson. As a post script to this story, twice, when George has visited Matthew's grave in the upper peninsula of Michigan, he has seen a large bald eagle soaring above. George does not think it a coincidence. What do you think?

We have not space for all the photos from George's trip. Upon their return home, Dan writes:

" I would be remiss if I did not tell why George so badly wanted to make another trip to Europe. George was very adamant about making sure to tell everyone he encountered that he was interested in representing "The rest of the division" that battled so hard with little or no attention paid to their efforts..... or worse yet, their efforts being attributed to E/506 just to make an interesting miniseries. He had many friends in E/506 and means no disrespect to any of them. He wants to remind all that there were very many units that distinguished themselves. George was very interested in the Polish Paratroopers as well that receive virtually no attention." We made a trip to Den Dungen, Holland on our way back to Brussels so George could see the septic tank where several airmen and Airbornes were hidden for 40 days to get smuggled out of the country. The conditions were so bad, that a match would not stay lit because of lack of oxygen. The men were let out at night for some relief. The story can be found in George's Hell's Highway book, Chapter 19, Behind Enemy Lines.

We visited the spot and the farmer's field was gone, now replaced by houses.

The Dutch people, however, did not forget what these men went through and the brave Dutch Resistance fighters who saved them. The picture shows the markings in the road where the tank



was located. No wonder why George loves the Dutch people so much! Den Dungen is a

picturesque little town and the people were very pleasant helping us find this spot."

One of the visits we made that was important to George was a visit to Driel to see the Polish Drop Zone. This is an incredible story that, if you are not familiar with, you should research. We saw the Polish Paratrooper Memorial as well as a monument remembering the efforts of General Sosabowski. This brave man survived the war only to end up working menial jobs until his death. The church in Driel remembers the Polish Paras and will not let their history go unforgotten. It is a shame that it is not largely known what happened there.

George told a funny story about this church



steeple. He said that General Taylor climbed to the top to see what the Germans were up to in the high ground across the river and told the two troopers he met at the top that they should direct mortar fire across at an

emplacement he saw and pester the Germans. The troopers tried to dissuade him and told him that by doing so they would shoot back and probably with something bigger than a mortar. He insisted and they did.

True to their prediction, the Germans answered the call just as the General was descending the stairs. The next thing he knew, he got blown off his feet and earned himself a Purple Heart. It turns out that the answering call the Germans lobbed in his direction had a piece of shrapnel with his name on it. It lodged in his ass and he spent 2 weeks with his butt in the air! George took great delight in telling that story!

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On September 14, 2013 my dad, Joseph Hennessey, I-502, got to fly once again in the C-47 for the annual luncheon in Rhode Island, along with seven other

WWII veterans. (flew last on Sept. 17, 2011). He was extremely happy and proud to be invited again.

The day was warm and sunny. My dad said the flight was enjoyable and memorable.

'Kilroy' was a 46-year old shipyard worker (James Kilroy) during the war who worked as a checker at the Fore

River Shipyard in Quincy . His job was to go around and check on the number of rivets completed. Riveters were on piecework and got paid by the rivet. He would count a block of rivets and put a check mark in semi-waxed lumber chalk, so the rivets wouldn't be counted twice. When Kilroy went off duty, the riveters would erase the mark.

Later on, an off-shift inspector would come through and count the rivets a second time, resulting in double pay for the riveters. One day Kilroy's boss called him into his office. The foreman was upset about all the wages being paid to riveters, and asked him to investigate. It was then he realized what had been going on. The tight spaces he had to crawl in to check the rivets didn't lend themselves to lugging around a paint can and brush, so Kilroy decided to stick with the waxy chalk. He continued to put his check mark on each job he inspected, but added

'KILROY WAS HERE' in king-sized letters next to the check, and eventually added the sketch of the chap with the long nose peering over the fence and that became part of the Kilroy message. Once he did that, the riveters stopped trying to wipe away his marks. Ordinarily the rivets and chalk marks would have been covered up with paint. With the war on, however, ships were leaving the Quincy Yard so fast that there wasn't time to paint them. As a result, Kilroy's inspection "trademark" was seen by thousands of servicemen who boarded the troopships the yard produced. His message apparently rang a bell with the servicemen, because they picked it up and spread it all over Europe and the South Pacific.

Before war's end, "Kilroy" had been here, there, and everywhere on the long hauls to Berlin and Tokyo. To the troops outbound in those ships, however, he was a complete mystery; all they knew for sure was that someone named Kilroy had "been there first."

As the war went on, the legend grew. Underwater demolition teams routinely sneaked ashore on Japanese-held islands in the Pacific to map the terrain for coming invasions by U.S. troops (and thus, presumably, were the first GI's there). On one occasion, however, they reported seeing enemy troops painting over the Kilroy logo!

In 1945, an outhouse was built for the exclusive use of Roosevelt, Stalin, and Churchill at the Potsdam conference. Its' first occupant was Stalin, who emerged and asked his aide (in Russian), "Who is Kilroy

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Berlin - The head of Hitler's Gestapo secret police and one of the organisers of the Holocaust,



Heinrich Mueller, was buried in a Jewish cemetery in Berlin in 1945, a German newspaper reported Thursday. For 68 years, the fate of "Gestapo-Mueller" has been unclear but Bild, based on documents found by a historian, said he died at the end of the war and was buried in a common grave in a Jewish cemetery in central Berlin. "Mueller didn't survive the end of the war," the mass circulation newspaper quoted Johannes Tuchel, head of the Memorial to the German Resistance, as saying.

"His body was interred in 1945 in the Jewish cemetery in Berlin-Mitte in a mass grave," he said. Mueller was long rumoured to have survived World War II.

Bild quoted a German BND foreign intelligence file stating that Mueller was in Carlsbad in the former Czechoslovakia in summer 1949. But Tuchel told Bild that the secret services were wrong, "Mueller's body was already found in August 1945 in a provisional grave near the former Reich's aviation ministry by a burial commando," he told Bild. His body was dressed in a general's uniform, Tuchel said. "In the inner left breast pocket was, among other things, his service certificate with a photo," he went on. Bild also printed a document it said was from the registrar's office in Berlin-Mitte showing Mueller was buried in the district's Jewish cemetery.

The leader of Germany's Jewish community, Dieter Graumann, reacted angrily.

"That one of the most brutal Nazi sadists is buried in a Jewish cemetery is a distasteful monstrosity. The memory of the victims is being treated here with contempt," he told Bild. Mueller attended the Wannsee Conference at a villa on the outskirts of Berlin in January 1942 at which senior Nazis

plotted the "Final Solution", a plan to exterminate all Jews in Nazi-occupied Europe.

The Original "Rosie the Riveter" is Still Working at Age 93

Rosie the Riveter is still a member of the work force. Elinor Otto, 93, was one of the original "Rosie The River" girls who started working in the 1940s when men went off to fight in World War 2. Otto started working at an aircraft assembly plant back in 1942 and she still has a job more than 70 years later.

Otto said: "We were part of this big thing. We hoped we'd win the war. We worked hard as women, and were proud to have that job."

The original Rosie the Riveter said that she made about 65 cents per hour when she first started working during World War 2. Her salary has increased a little since then, she now makes about \$39 an hour, but Otto said that it's never really been about the money.



Otto said: "I'm a working person, I guess. I like to work. I like to be around people that work. I like to get up, get out of the house, get something accomplished during the day.

The Daily Mail reports that Otto started working on planes in 1942 for the Rohr Aircraft Corporation in Chula Vista. When the war ended

she decided that she wanted to continue working on plans. She worked with the Ryan Aeronautical Co. in San Diego for 14 years and is currently working at Boeing's C-17 plant in Long Beach. Otto's colleague Craig Ryba said: "She's an inspiration. She just enjoys working and enjoys life."
